John F. "Jack" McBride Jr., 45, a lifetime Aberdeen resident, died Thursday, March 14 1996, in Aberdeen, of an undetermined cause while riding his bicycle. He was born Dec. 27, 1950, in Aberdeen, to John F. and Murial (Hadtrath) McBride St. He was a 1970 graduate of Aberdeen High School and received an associate's degree in mechanical engineering from Grays Harbor College in 1982. He served in the Army and had been a millworker at Weyerhaeuser. Survivors include his mother of Aberdeen; a brother, Gerald of Aberdeen; two sisters, Terry Broten of Startup, and Kathryn Campbell of Anchorage, Alaska; five sons, Timothy of Olympia, John F. III, who is in the Navy, Andrew and Derrick, both of Montesano, and David Larson, who is in the Marines; and one grandchild. A memorial service is scheduled for 11 a.m. Thursday, March 21, at the Whiteside Funeral Chapel of Aberdeen. A gathering of family and mend will follow at the Aberdeen VFW.
