Steve Wayne Nolan, 38, was the first born son to Jerry Wayne Nolan and Susan Kay Kelley Nolan on January 14, 1975, in Longview, Washington. He fought a short but brave battle with Lung Cancer, grew his wings and went to be with the Lord on June 16, 2013, in Olympia, Washington.
