Lifelong Harborite Doris E. Aleshire, 75, of Ocosta, died Sunday, June 29, 1997, in a local nursing home. She was born Feb. 19, 1922, in Hoquiam, to Louis and Anne Peterson. She attended school the first 10 years in Hoquiam and graduated from Aberdeen High School. In September 1941, she married Donald E. Willis in Hoquiam. He died in 1961. She married N.A. Aleshire in February of 1964 in Raymond. He survives at the family home. Mrs. Aleshire had worked as a waitress and bartender in several restaurants on the Harbor, including the Canton. The Bright Spot and John's Place, all in Aberdeen. She retired in the mid-1970s. She enjoyed river fishing, sewing and arts and crafts. She was an avid baseball fan. often following three separate games at once, and loved Bingo - at times playing up to 16 cards at a time, while helping others to keep from missing any numbers on their cards. Mrs. Aleshire also loved spending time with her grandchildren. In addition to her husband, she is survived by two sons, Don Willis of Aberdeen and former Aberdeen resident, Gerald L. Aleshire (address unavailable); three daughters, Linda Eby of Aberdeen. Debbie Dixon of Olympia and Dale E. Dineen of Copalis Crossing; 10 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. A memory service is set for 2 p.m. Wednesday, July 2, in the Coleman Mortuary Chapel at Hoquiam. The service will conclude at the chapel, with a family inturment service in the Wynoochee Cemetery at Montesano.
