Joe Baretich of Aberdeen died Wednesday, Jan. 1, 2003, at Grays Harbor Community Hospital. He was 87. He was born in Aberdeen on Feb. 28, 1915, to Sam and Mary (Harmia) Baretich. He attended Wishkah Valley School and Weatherwax High School. He was in the Army and served during World War II in Europe. He married Blanche Wilson on July 14, 1950, in Aberdeen. She died on May 19, 2002. He was a longshoreman and member of the International Longshore & Warehouse Union Local No. 24 in Aberdeen. He also owned and operated a fishing boat in Westport called the Willy Jo. He was a member of the Aberdeen Eagles No. 24, the VFW Post No. 224 and the 40 et 8 club. He was also a 65-year member of the Croatian - Lodge. He enjoyed fishing the Hoh River and in Alaska. He made wine at home, smoked fish for his family, hunted and cut wood with an ax. He usually had enough wood to last him for 5 years. Survivors include a daughter, Diane Shaw of Hoquiam; a sister, Zora Raincock of Olympia; one grandchild and one great-grandchild. Three brothers, Steve, Johnne and Frank, and three sisters, Sylvia Walczyk, Rose Hanson and Georgia Gaston all died before him. A graveside service is set for 1 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 7, at St. John's Cemetery in the Wishkah Valley. Arrangements are by the Fern Hill Funeral Home of Aberdeen.
