Arthur Cobain

Arthur D. "Buddy" Cobain, 52, a former Aberdeen Fireman and life-time Grays Harbor area resident, died Friday, March 17, 1995, at his home in the Wishkah Valley area. "I worked with Art for virtually all of my career," said Aberdeen Fire Chief Steve Mitchell Monday. "He was very dependable. He went out on a lot of our big fires and you could always depend on him being there, backing you up in a big fire. You didn't have to keep your eyes on him. You knew he'd stay there with you." He was born Aug. 15, 1942, in Aberdeen to Ernest and Edna (Culver) Cobain. He was raised and attended school in Aberdeen and Ocosta, and graduated from the Ocosta School in 1959. He entered the Navy after graduation and served aboard an aircraft carrier, where he was involved in aircraft maintenance. He served in the Pacific Ocean area, which included being stationed near Midway Island. Following his military discharge, he returned to the Grays Harbor area and resided in the Montesano-Wynochee Valley area. He was employed by Pettit Oil Company, Lamb's of Grays Harbor, Weyerhaeuser and also operated his own company called the Stanley Fuel Company. e married Louise Bartee in 1964. They were later divorced. e began his service with the Aberdeen Fire Department in 1968. There, he had been a firefighter, an engineer and an emergency medical technician. He retired from the fire department in 1989, following 231 years of service to the department.

He married Margann Hawks Jan. 14, 1983, in Aberdeen. She survives at the family home in Wishkah. He was later employed by the State of Washington Fisheries, before returning to Pettit Oil Company in 1992. e enjoyed organic gardening, the outdoors, fishing, camping and hunting. For many years, he helped with the operation of St. John's Cemetery in the Wishkah Valley area. in addition to his wife, survivors include two daughters, Ruth and Lyneine, both of the family home in Wishkah; a brother, Ernie of Montesano; three sisters, Sheryl of Federal Way, Beverly of Bremerton and Becky Ratliff of Albuquerque, NM; a step-daughter, Tina Allen of Aberdeen. son Luke Cobain, died in 1993. memory service with military honors is scheduled for 1 a.m. Wednesday in the South Aberdeen Baptist Church, 620 Fordney Street Memorial may be sent to the Arthur Cobain Memorial Fund, c/o the Humptulips Valley Church, P.O. 146, Humptulips 98552. Coleman Mortuary of Hoquiam is in charge of arrangements.
