

## Joseph Cornell Sr.

LAS VEGAS, Nev. — Former longtime Hoquiamite Joseph Cornell Sr., 82, of Las Vegas, Nev., died Sunday, March 16, 1997, in the Sunrise Hospital there.

Cornell was born July 16, 1914, at Philadelphia, Pa., to Jack and Margaret Cornell. He was raised in Philadelphia, where he graduated from high school.

He served in the Army from 1933 to 1939, stationed at Fort Knox, Ky., for three years and at Fort Lewis the rest of the time.

While he was at Fort Lewis, he met Thelma G. Mott of Hoquiam. They were married Oct. 1, 1938, at Tacoma, and she survives at the family home in Las Vegas.

The couple moved to the Harbor, where Cornell worked for Lumber Supplies Inc. and Bay City Fuel, both of Aberdeen, and in various mills. He was employed by Woodlawn Plywood, which later became Hoquiam Plywood, from 1955 until his retirement in 1978. He was also one of the original stockholders there.

In 1980, Cornell and his wife moved to Las Vegas, where they spent nine months of each year, returning to summer in Washington.

Cornell served on the Wishkah Valley School Board and had been president of the Grays Harbor County School Board. He also belonged to the Hoquiam Eagles No. 252 Aerie.

Besides his wife, he is sur-

vived by two sons, Joe of Central Park and James T. of Gold Bar; seven grandchildren; one great-grandson; three step-grandchildren and three step-great-grandchildren.
