Lee Lloyd Lewis, 80, a long time Grays Harbor resident, died Wednesday, April 22, 1992 at a local nursing home, following an extended illness. He was born Feb. 5, 1912, in Forestgrove, Montana to Henry W. and Alice Josephine (Vincent) Lewis. His childhood years were spent in various areas of the Northwest, including Idaho, Oregon and Wyoming. He. Enjoyed telling stories about how he hand hewed railroad ties in Yellowstone Nation Park when he was 12. He later settled in Yakima, where he harvested fruit. In 1931 he moved from Yakima to Moclips. In 1932, he married Violet D. Kilgore in Yakima. He worked as a logger for Aloha Timber Co. The couple moved to Copalis Crossing in 1939 and then to Hoquiam a few years later. He worked for the Boeing Co. for a few years during World War II. He then worked at Evans Products until he retired as a pressman in 1972. The couple moved to East Hoquiam in 1950, where he had resided ever since. He enjoyed the outdoors, including hunting and fishing. He used to fashion "fox" shovels into clam shovels that were less likely to smash the clam's shells. They were sold to clam diggers at Brody's Store at Chenois Creek and some were sold in Alaska as well. Lewis also raised dairy cows on his land, selling milk and cream. He had been a member of the Hoquiam Eagle Aire No. 252 for many years, and also belonged to the Timber Operators Council of the International Woodworkers of American Local 3-2. His wife Violet survives him, he is also survived by his daughter Mrs. Orville (Patty) Bieniek of the East Hoquiam. Interment will be at the St. John's Cemetery in the Wishkah Valley.
