Aberdeen man killed in head-on crash at Fife

FIFE — Aberdeen resident Frederick William Lowe, 87, was killed Tuesday when the car he was driving collided head-on with another car on Interstate 5 near Fife, the State Patrol said.

Southbound traffic was backed up several miles for more than two hours after the accident, which occurred at 9:19 a.m. just north of the Fife exit.

Lowe was northbound when his 1989 Mitsubishi Galant crossed the grassy median and crashed into a Ford Escort driven by Seattle resident Arthur L. Richardson, 29.

Lowe's was then rammed from behind by another car, troopers said.

Richardson escaped with relatively minor injuries and was reported in satisfactory condition at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle.

The driver of the third car, 53-year-old Charles Lander from the Bellevue area, was treated as an outpatient at St. Francis Hospital in Federal Way.

Lowe, who lived at 5149 Wishkah Road, was wearing a seatbelt, but was pronounced dead at Harborview.

Investigators could not immediately explain what caused Lowe's car to cross into the oncoming lanes.
