**JAY N. REYNVAAN**

Jay N. Reynvaan, 32, lifetime Hoquiam area resident, died Saturday, June 22, 1996, at his home in Hoquiam. He was born June 16, 1964, in Aberdeen to Donald W. and Nadine (Noe) Reynvaan. He attended Hoquiam and Wishkah schools, and later worked as a shake block cutter. He then worked as a logger, trimmer, faller, cat skinner, hook tender and held other jobs on the rigging crew. He worked for Sholes, Papac and J.T. Spradlin. In 1991, he married Cheryl Sjogren in Montesano. She survives at the family home in Longview. He spent three weeks visiting Tim and Amber Eaton in Alaska in 1993, and while there enjoyed tourist activities such as visiting the Million Dollar Bridge, glaciers and fishing. He liked to ocean fish with his brother Max, at the Hoquiam and Wishkah Rivers.

Reynvaan liked to be around children, and also blazing new roads in his 4 x 4 truck. He had assisted in the care of his mother, who died in 1994. He did many chores including firewood cutting and mowing her lawn. Along with his wife and father, he is survived by a daughter, Janessa of Longview, a son, Michael, also in Longview; his brother Max of Hoquiam; and two sisters, Monica Davis of Montesano and his twin sister Jan Borns of Elma. A gathering of family and friends will be held at 1 p.m. Thursday, July 4, at the home of Tim and Amber Eaton, 2467 E. Hoquiam Rd. Family inurnment services will be held at a later date at the Wynoochee Cemetery, Montesano. Coleman Mortuary of Hoquiam is in charge.
