Together they built a beautiful life, full of love. Family was one of the most important things in life to her. She cherished every moment and love us all unconditionally. Sheryl was known for always hosting any type of gathering she could. She truly loved people and welcomed all with open arms.

She owned and operated her own recovery center, Chance for Change in Longview, then was a staff member of Starting Point.
